There's a phrase etched in my brain and our culture of motorcycling, a quiet declaration that every rider knows by heart:

"If I have to explain, you wouldn't understand."

It's more than just a slogan. It's a shield, a secret handshake, a line drawn between those who ride and those who never will. It's not about arrogance—it's about experience. The kind of experience that starts the moment you throw a leg over a bike and doesn't stop until the engine cools hours later, long after the road has vanished behind you. Riding a motorcycle is not just transportation. It's not just a "cheaper way to get around" or a "dangerous hobby." It's freedom in the purest sense. We talk about the community—the brothers and sisters on two wheels who wave to each other across highways and parking lots like old friends. We talk about the peace we find in motion, the clarity that comes when the only thing that matters is the road ahead and the ride beneath. We talk about the joy of a sunset ride, the feeling of being alive in a way a car could never replicate.

But sometimes, no words are enough.

Because the truth is—it can't be explained. It has to be felt.

The joy of riding is a soul-deep satisfaction that only a rider knows. It's why we fight for our rights—not just for ourselves, but for the next generation of riders. Helmet choice, profiling, parking access, and the freedom to ride without harassment—these aren't luxuries. They're essential to preserving the spirit of motorcycling. And if we don't stand up for it, who will?

So next time someone asks, "What's the big deal about riding?" Smile.

Maybe you'll try to explain it—maybe you won't.

But deep down, you'll know:

If I have to explain, you wouldn't understand.

And that's okay. Because out on the open road, with the sun at your back and the throttle in your hand, **you** understand. And that's all that matters.



MRF Legislative Champions

As part of the Bikers Inside the Beltway event, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) presents Legislative Champion awards during the visit to Capitol Hill. While we present the awards at Bikers Inside the Beltway in May, the award honors legislators for their work in previous years. This year, the MRF honored Senator Todd Young of Indiana and Representative Jay Obernolte of California.

Senator Young is a longtime friend of the bikers in Indiana and was the keynote speaker at the 2020 Meeting of the Minds in Indianapolis. He serves on the Commerce, Science and Transportation Committee and played a key role in the appointment of MRF Vice President Jay Jackson as a member of the Motorcyclist Advisory Council.

Representative Obernolte is a member of the House Energy and Commerce Committee where he is a leading voice in defense of the internal combustion engine. Despite being a lawmaker from California, Rep. Obernolte is a vocal critic of the excessive power the California Air Resources Board (CARB) yields on emissions policy. He recently joined the Congressional Motorcycle Caucus and we are grateful for this demonstration of his ongoing support of motorcyclists nationwide.

These two lawmakers are now the 13th and 14th to be so honored. All MRF Legislative Champions are presented with a leather vest by MRF leadership and constituents during the annual May visit. Thank you to Senator Young and Congressman Obernolte for their continued support of biker rights and their friendship with so many in the motorcycling community!

What to Include in a Motorcycle Trauma Kit


While the specific contents of a trauma kit can vary, here are some essential items to include:

SHARE THE ROAD is a motorcycle awareness program that promotes driver awareness and increases understanding of how motorcycles behave in traffic. ABATE of Nebraska, Inc. provides trained volunteers to present this program to the public. We believe that education and training are the best ways to prevent, and thereby reduce, motorcycle/automobile accidents.

Research shows that three fourths of crashes involving a motorcycle also involves another motor vehicle, which is usually at fault. Considering crash statistics and the increasing number of motorcyclists, the key to a safer riding mix is learning to SHARE THE ROAD.

Motorcycles are very different from automobiles - they are much smaller in size & are harder to see then automobiles. The failure of motorists to see motorcyclists in traffic is the most common cause of crashes. Car drivers who are involved in an accident with a motorcycle often do not see the motorcycle prior to the crash, or until it is too late to avoid having the crash.

The greatest risk area for a conflict between a motorcycle and a automobile is at an intersection...whether it is in the middle of an urban area, a driveway on a residential street, or anywhere where traffic may cross your path of travel. Over one half of motorcycle/car crashes are caused by drivers

entering a rider's right-of-way. Cars that turn left in from of motorcyclists, including cars turning left from the lane to the right, and cars on side streets that pull into the motorcyclists lane are the biggest dangers.

The fact remains.....the best way to prevent any accident is through Education, Safety, and Motorcycle Awareness Programs like SHARE THE ROAD.




